### **Committee Reports**

Executive Committee – Madam Basileus  
There was a misunderstanding about the chapter's allowed number of delegates. Six were selected, but only five were certified. The recommendation of the Executive Committee was that the sixth delegate be reimbursed the NARC registration fee of \$185.00 from the Contingency budget. It was moved by Soror Jasmine Adkins Moore and seconded that the committee's recommendation be accepted. The motion was carried.

Soror Adams reported on and the committee recommended three fund raisers and assessment.
